The Inclusion of the Land East of Pincents Lane as a development site:

Lane East of Pincents Lane should not be included in this plan. Objections have been raised each time a planning application is is submitted with regard to access, traffic, congestion and amenities and each time the council have been upheld by the planning office and planning permission refused. I cannot understand why this area has now been added to the local plan as appropriate for development.
