A young person's full autism diagnosis paperwork is required for a referral to our team. This can be a private diagnosis or through CAMHS. The copy of the autism diagnosis paperwork counts as the referral to enable us to work with the young person individually in school and for our family advisor to speak individually with parents/carers where appropriate. We aim to become involved within 12 weeks of receiving paperwork.
