Pre-school children – referred via ophthalmology departments following diagnosis of a vision impairment which meets criteria for referral – e.g. a visual acuity of 6/12 or lower or better acuity with compounding factors such as nystagmus.

School age children – referred by the school setting with a letter from the eye clinic detailing eye condition and vision information to show meets criteria + parental consent

Other - Referrals may also be made by other sensory support services for children moving into the area / local authorities requesting assessments for EHCP for children new to the area.

Upon receipt of referral

Pre-school children identified at eye clinic – phone call with family within 5 working days of receipt of referral (including school holidays). Assessment booked within 4 working weeks and report completed within 8 working weeks of receipt of referral and supporting evidence + parental consent.

Following assessment child may be discharged with advice and information or come onto caseload for monitoring, advisory or teaching support dependant on need.

EHCNA reports for students not on caseload but requested by LA

To include range of training / assessment / report / AR / direct work on a teaching programme in line with the Curriculum Framework for CYP with a vision impairment (CFVI).
